#### Administration

• Review and approval of the minutes for the Partnership Table meeting held on October 7, 2020, was deferred to a later meeting.

#### **Regular Business**

- 1. Decolonize YYT Conference
  - The Conference Planning Committee has finalized all conference details, including speakers, the agenda, livestreaming, and the facilitated sessions.
    - Notable speakers include Hon. Carolyn Bennett, federal Minister of Crown–Indigenous Relations; Hon. Lisa Dempster, provincial Minister of Indigenous Affairs and Reconciliation; His Worship Danny Breen, Mayor of St. John's; and Jesse Thistle, best-selling author of the memoir *From the Ashes*.
    - Three Indigenous speakers have also been confirmed for the Keynote Panel on November 5, 2020. The panel will be moderated by Catherine Fagan, Vice-President of First Light.
  - To focus discussions at each of the four "Policy in Focus" sessions, the Conference Planning Committee has developed participant briefs that draw on the work of the Community Action Plan Subcommittee that was convened on October 13, 2020. Tied to each of the coalition's four priority areas, these sessions will focus on identifying specific objectives in the following areas:
    - Session 1 on Health and Wellness will focus on (a) improving the delivery healthcare services; (b) developing stronger cultural and security supports for those involved in the justice system; and (c) strengthening respect for Indigenous languages and cultures.
    - Session 2 on Education, Training, and Employment will focus on (a) developing and delivering cultural diversity training for professionals working in strategic areas; (b) developing and deploying better curricula

at all levels of the education system, as well as for the general public; and (c) promoting employment equity.

- Session 3 on Infrastructure and Service Delivery will focus on (a) combatting systemic discrimination; (b) reducing poverty; and (c) expanding inclusive cultural spaces.
- Session 4 on Housing and Homelessness will focus on implementing MMIWG Calls for Justice 4.6 and 4.7.
- With approximately 70 participants registered in total, all four "Policy in Focus" sessions are now fully subscribed. Participants include government officials from all levels; representatives from community organizations; service providers; researchers, academics, and students; and members of the urban Indigenous community.
- To help promote online attendance at the public sessions as well as the public education goals of the conference, a media release was circulated to local media on November 3, 2020. It is also available on the First Voice website.

#### **Other Business**

 It was agreed that action to advance TRC 16 ("Create university and college degree and diploma programs in Indigenous languages") should be included in the coalition's Community Action Plan. It was further agreed that there are likely opportunities to coordinate action in this area with the development and implementation of Memorial University's Strategic Framework for Indigenization.
